



"A prototype is an early sample, model, or release of a product built to test a concept or process"



The prototype cycle






What is a Patent?

"A <u>patent</u> is a form of intellectual property that gives its owner the legal right to exclude others from making, using, selling, and importing an invention for a limited period of years, in exchange for publishing an enabling public disclosure of the invention"

What is Intellectual property?

- Intellectual property is a category of property that includes intangible creations of the human intellect
- Intellectual Property (IP) refers to the protection of creations of the mind, which have both a moral and a commercial value.





Types of IP





Protecting your IP

- Signed contracts of engagement
- Non Disclosure Agreement (NDA)
- Patents, Trademark, Copyright, Trade secrets
- If you are an academic engage with your university legal team
